In the original edition of *No Greater Threat*, released in October, 2002, attorney C. William Michaels provided what was to become the only book to contain a review and analysis of the *entire* USA PATRIOT Act. The book also featured historical commentary and the author's description of "12 common characteristics of a national security state" with an examination of how close America was coming to fulfilling those characteristics, in the shadow of that sweeping anti-terrorism statute.

Now, three years later, an extensive (revised) Second Edition of *No Greater Threat* contains examinations of various anti-terrorism developments since the PATRIOT Act to the close of 2004, unique to a single volume. In addition to retaining the entire text of the original edition, the Second Edition contains a further analysis of events related to the PATRIOT Act since its enactment, and *a complete review and analysis of three other major legislative anti-terrorism events since 2001*: the Homeland Security Act (2002), the (proposed) Domestic Security Enhancement Act (2003) (often called "PATRIOT Act II"), and the Intelligence Reform Act (2004).

Beyond these extremely significant analyses, the Second Edition goes on to comment upon or examine: Congressional anti-terrorism proposals including various proposals to amend or modify the PATRIOT Act, the Administration's numerous "National Strategy" policy papers dealing with terrorism (including "The National Strategy on Homeland Security" and "The National Security Strategy of the United States"), the Supreme Court's 2004 terrorism decisions, other federal appeals court decisions relating to terrorism (since the PATRIOT Act), selected anti-terrorism prosecutions since 2002, the situation in Guantanamo Bay / Camp Delta, the 9/11 Commission recommendations, various new or expanded government programs related to anti-terrorism--most of them administered through Department of Homeland Security or Department of Justice (such as JTTFs (Joint Terrorism Task Forces), ISIS (Integrated Surveillance and Intelligence System), NSEERS (National Security Entry Exit Registration System), SEVIS (Student Exchange and Visitor Information System), US-VISIT (United States Visitor and Immigration Status Indication Technology), Secure Flight, Registered Traveler, and Operation Liberty Shield), and international situations.

The Second Edition continues with an exhaustively detailed update and review, as of the close of 2004, of the author's 12 common characteristics of a national security state, with commentary on a host of recent developments and current trends, and offers new "ratings" for those characteristics. *This new edition of No Greater Threat presents, in a single volume, an extraordinarily comprehensive overview of the "war on terrorism."*
